

Development of Poznan Strategy Program

2007. COP requested GEF to establish programme promoting investment in technology transfer, to help developing countries address their climate tech needs

2008. GEF established Poznan strategic programme (PSP) with funding of USD 50 million

1. TNAs
2. Piloting priority Technology projects linked to TNAs
3. Dissemination of GEF experience and successfully demonstrated environmentally sound technologies (ESTs)

2010. GEF outlined elements of long-term implementation of PSP:

1. Climate technology centres and climate technology network
2. Piloting technology projects
3. Public-private partnership for technology transfer
4. Technology needs assessments
5. GEF as catalytic supporting institution for technology transfer

National, Regional and Global projects

Piloting technology projects

11 pilot projects, supporting tech transfer on:

Mitigation tech: renewable energy, energy efficiency, transport, and composting

Adaptation tech: irrigation

Climate technology centres and climate technology network

4 regional tech centres under implementation: Africa (AfDB), Asia and Pacific (ADB/UNEP), Eastern Europe and Central Asia (EBRD), Latin American and Caribbean (IADB)

GEF also supported a Climate Technology Centre and Network project

Technology needs assessments

2009: USD 11 million to 36 developing countries for TNAs. Project completed.

2013: USD 8.2 million to 28 developing countries for TNAs. Project under execution.

2016: USD 6.1 million to 20 SIDs and LDCs for TNAs. Approved in 2016.

GEF 7 Replenishment Process

- ✓ Paragraph 10 of the Instrument for the Establishment of the Restructured GEF provides that “the Trustee’s responsibility for mobilization of resources pursuant to paragraph 20 (e) of this Instrument and paragraph 4(a) of Annex B shall be initiated for subsequent replenishment [of the GEF Trust Fund] at the request of the Council.”
- ✓ The GEF is currently operating under the sixth replenishment period of the GEF Trust Fund covering the period July 1, 2014 to June 30, 2018.
- ✓ With the sixth replenishment period ending on June 30, 2018, it is recommended that discussions on the seventh replenishment of the GEF Trust Fund be initiated, with a view to concluding by April 2018.

The Council, at its 51st meeting, requested the Trustee, in cooperation with the Secretariat, to initiate discussions on the seventh replenishment of resources of the GEF Trust Fund.
